PROGRAMME SPECIFIC OUTCOMES OF FINE ARTS

- 1. In this course the student will learn the Painting from objects and nature study as well as placement or arrangement of visual elements in a work of art.

- 3. In this course the student will learn the simple composition in Painting, techniques of Brushes and use of different colour scheme and sheets.

- 6. In this course students will learn about the principles and elements of painting and drawing.
- 7. The purpose of this course is to introduce students to basic geometrical and perspective drawing of simple objects.
- 8. This course will provide understanding about how art uniquely expresses human thought, value and emotions.
- 9. Compare and contrast artistic styles from different historical periods and cultures.
- 10. Produce creative works that demonstrate innovation in concepts, formal language and/or materials.

COURSE OUTCOMES

Paper- A (History of Indian Art)

SEMESTER - 1 & 2
